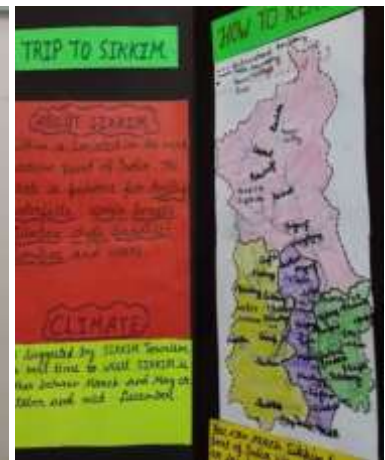
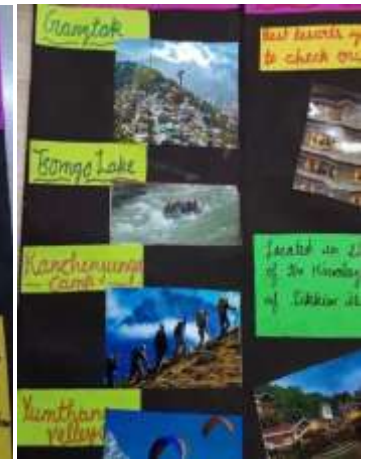
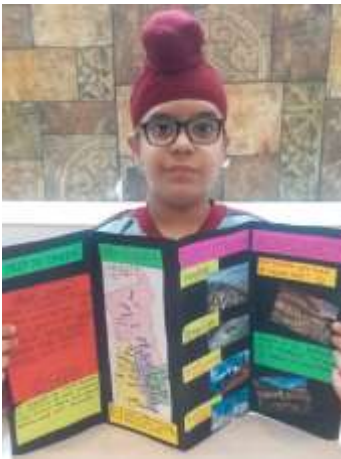
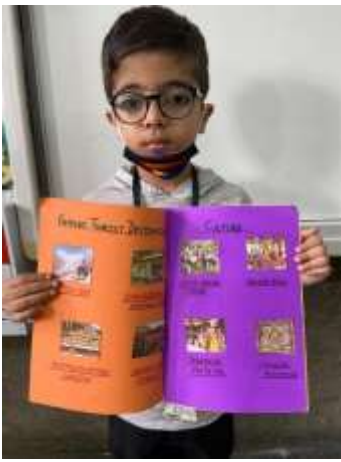
##### **Scrap book activity on Sikkim**

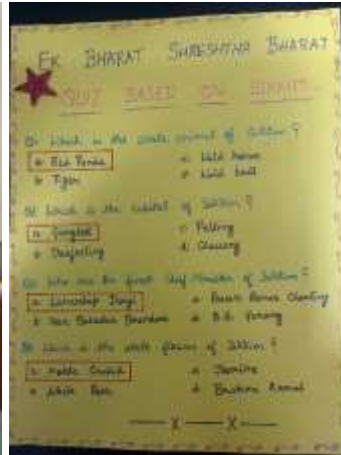


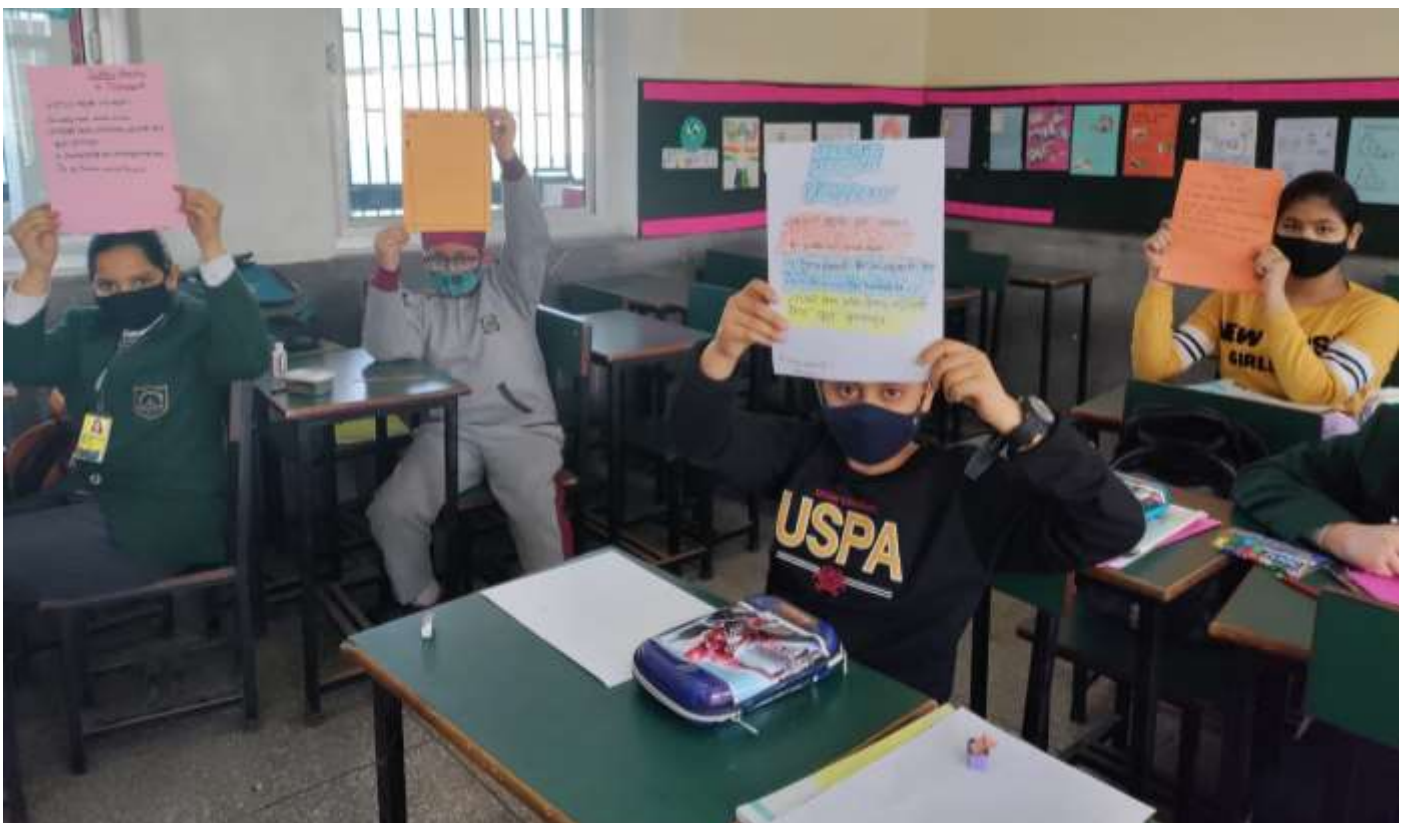
## KNOW YOUR PAIRED STATE: SIKKIM
