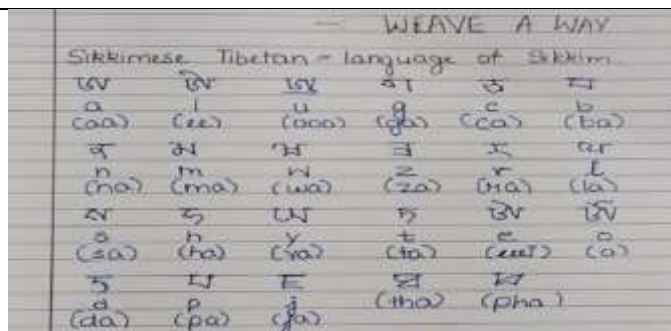
WEAVE A WAY

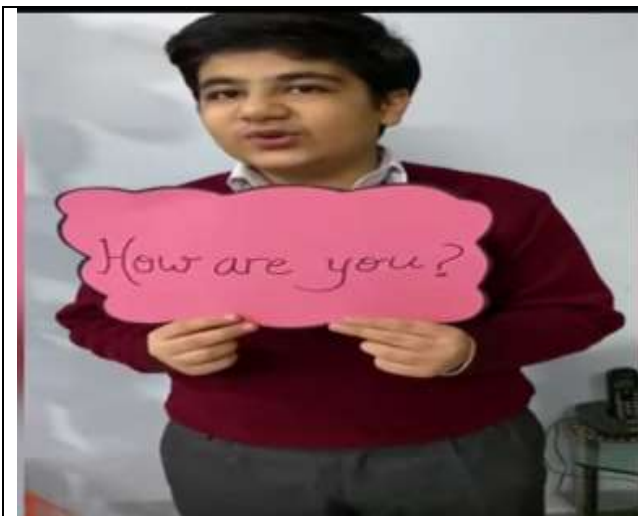

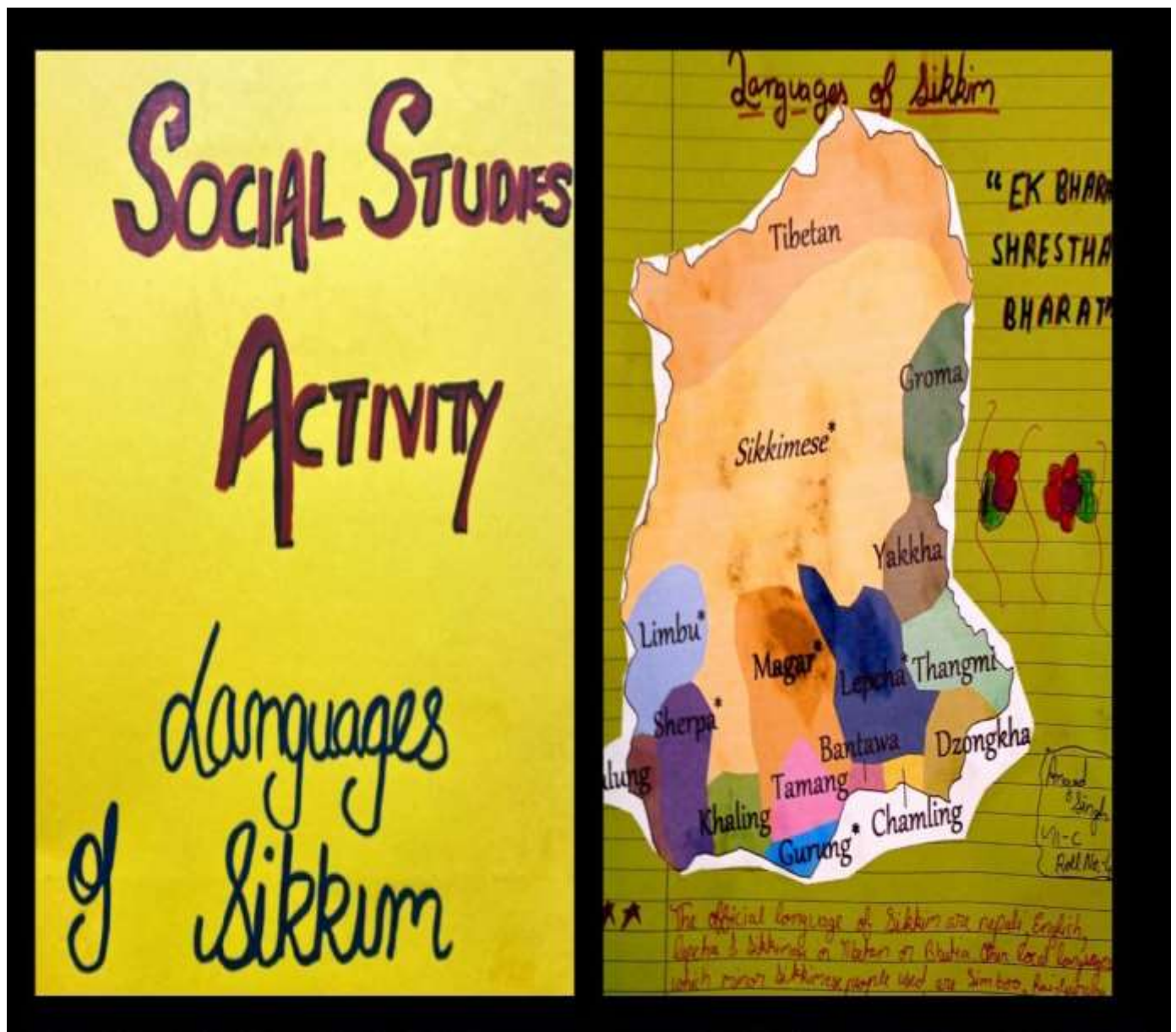
2. As per the guidelines of CBSE under the theme of 'EK BHARA BHARATHIYA BHARAT' all the students of Arki are encouraged to be involved in activities aligning with the state of Sikkim. To pursue the same, Class 8 students will search 10 proverbs in any language of Sikkim and write them on A-4 size sheet. You can also use illustrations to convey their meanings.

PROVERBS	Meaning in English	Translation in Sikkim (Nepali) language
1. Practice makes perfect	If you want to be perfect at something, you need to practice every day.	अभ्यासले निपुण बनाउँछ।
2. Better late than never	It's better if you do something later, than not do it at all.	धेरै नै होस् भनेर नभएको राम्रो हो।
3. Easy Come, Easy go	When something, especially money, is easily got and then soon spent or lost.	सजिलो आउँछ सजिलो जान्छ।
4. No pain, No gain	If you don't work hard, you will never achieve your goal.	गुनै थियो गुनै नभयो।
5. Don't judge a book by its cover	Don't judge people (or for that matter, places or things) solely on their appearance.	बाहिर देखेर नमान्नु।

6. All good things come to an end.	Nothing great lasts forever.	सबै राम्रा कुरा अन्तमा पुग्छन्।

8. Honesty is the best policy.	Being honest is the best characteristic.	सच्चाई नै सबैभन्दा राम्रो गुण हो।
9. Laughter is a best medicine.	Trying to be happy is the best cure.	हँसोले सबै कुरा राम्रो गर्छ।
10. Forgive and forget.	Forbear and hold on or restraint regarding a certain event.	माफ गर्नु र अगाडि बढ्नु।
