Mata Jai Kaur Public School's participation in this significant event was marked by students presenting their National Award-Winning Project, "**The She Safe Device - Empowering Differently Abled Girls**", created by the school's **Tech Club** under the guidance of **Ms Deepa Bhandari**. This ingenious device, programmed using MicroBits, is designed to ensure the safety of differently-abled girls. It offers four essential functions: (1) Anti-Stalking Device, (2) Anti-Theft Alarm, (3) Red Weather Alert, and (4) SOS Signal. The device incorporates light anti-stalking, touch anti-theft sensors, and a WeatherBit add-on for weather alerts. The device also sends SOS signals when shaken, providing a crucial safety feature for its users.

The **CBSE National Summit** witnessed enthusiastic participation from more than **250 schools** across India. The event was divided **into The Summit and The Skill Expo**.
